

Short Advisory Board on Strength of the United Fund Grant 2024 in Context

Background and Purpose

One of the key areas of the 2024 UFG is **Context**, which is relevant to the **Strength of the United Fund** and suggests that the work of the UFG should focus on the **Strength of the United Fund**.

The role of the **Short Advisory Board (SAB)** is to provide input and feedback on opportunities to build a healthy and resilient culture.

Who are we looking for?

Each member of the SAB will hold the following criteria:

- 1. **Organizational Knowledge:** The SAB members proposed to assess the current organizational health that serves as a guide for the "Terms of Reference" and the **Strength Plan**.
- 2. **Independence:** SAB members must not be directly involved in preparing organizational work or at present, should be an independent, objective organization that can give and receive an honest assessment of organizational health.
- 3. **Technical Competence:** The SAB members should have a deep professional skill set and expertise that will enable the group to effectively identify, analyze and describe a broad range of risks and challenges. Each member of the SAB must have the capacity to assess organizational performance in a wide range of the following areas:
 - 1. Programmatic management and implementation
 - 2. Financial management, including budgeting, accounting, tax and regulatory issues, costing
 - 3. HR
 - 4. Governance/structure
 - 5. Information management
 - 6. Human rights
 - 7. Health and safety
 - 8. Diversity
 - 9. Organizational Development
 - 10. Mission/ethics
 - 11. Strategy
 - 12. Risk/Resilience Capacity
 - 13. Sustainability
